Question 1:

You have listed districts as the BEN's (Billed Entity Numbers) verify with Client Service Bureau that schools not listed will be able to issue 471's?

Response 1:

CES has submitted correction to our Form 470 to Universal Service Administrative Company, School and Library Division (SLD) to add the Billed Entities not listed on the original Form 470 (see attached Exhibit A).

Question 2:

The administration fee of 1% section, says it will be charged to the vendor, but it was my understanding it is paid by school to CES on a NON E-Rate PO?

Background:

RFP 2009-008, Section I: Instruction to Offeror, E; Listing of General Terms and Conditions, Administrative Fee, Pages 20, 27, 37, & 43

Administrative Fee: CES' one percent (1%) administrative fee must be included in Offeror's net price for construction, material, equipment item's price, labor rates, freight charges and bond costs. The CES administrative fee will be taken as a deduction off each line-item's cost when CES prepares its' purchase order to the contractor, unless an alternative pricing method has been approved by CES.

Contractor's Quote/Proposal to CES Member: When preparing a quote/proposal under a CES awarded contract, the contractor must clearly identify and break out supplies, materials, equipment and services into individual line items as they appear on the contractor's awarded price schedule. Stated prices must include the CES one percent (1%) administrative fee.

Price List: The contractor will furnish CES with copies of the approved price list to facilitate eligible procurement agencies in placing orders. When the contractor offers a discount off retail price, the Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Price (MSRP), such discounts will include the CES one percent (1%) administrative fee and must be submitted as printed by the manufacturer.

Total Project Costs: Total Member's costs include energy, facilities, repair costs, present values of monies, vendor charges, personnel costs, bonds, New Mexico gross receipt taxes, CES one percent (1%) administrative fee and all other identifiable costs. Contractor charges include all the costs of contractor support, materials, transportation, permit fees and all other identifiable costs associated with the proposal. Contractor costs means the costs of all hardware, materials, software, transportation, contractor support, warranty fees and all other identifiable costs associated with the project proposal. Contractor support means services provided by the contractor, such as consulting, education, training, management of the system purchased and other integration and maintenance support.

Response 2:

The CES fee will be paid by the awarded vendor to CES. CES will work with the awarded vendor and the Member as to the most efficient method for processing purchase orders and payments while complying with SLD rules and regulations.

Question 3:

Payment section should be rewritten that school issues PO directly to vendor for E-Rate portion?

Background:

RFP 2009-008, Section I: Instruction to Offeror, E; Listing of General Terms and Conditions, Related to Billing and Payments, Pages 22, 31, & 36

Billing: All invoices will be from the contractor to CES and will be organized, detailed and contain the following: the purchase order number(s) issued by CES, the name of the CES Member or agency where the products/services were delivered and an itemized and detailed listing of all products and services being billed with their CES contract price. The contractor will not invoice a CES Member directly. CES will invoice the CES Member with payment to be made to CES. The contractor will not accept an order from or issue an invoice to any New Mexico public agency based on their contract unless authorized by CES in advance and in writing.

Lease and Rentals: Contractor may allow Members to enter into rent, lease or lease/purchase agreements, providing such agreements are in compliance with New Mexico Statutes and Public

Education Department policies, rules and regulations. CES must receive a copy of the executed leasing documents before it will process a purchase order. CES will not collect lease payments. Offeror agrees that leases will be in compliance with the Uniform Commercial Code. All terms of leasing must be included in the bid, with interest rates described as related to a government standard. Offeror must indicate in its response to this solicitation if the shipping costs for the return of leased or rented equipment are the responsibility of the procurement unit, and what that cost will be. No sale of a contract to a third party will be made without informing CES and the procurement unit of the transfer. If contractor sells a lease contract to a third party, the cost of return must not be greater than the cost of return to the original contractor.

Payment: CES will make every effort to collect payment from its Members for the purchase of services, construction or items of tangible personal property within thirty (30) days after the acceptable delivery and receipt of products or services has been obtained, the contractor has obtained and provided CES with all copies of forms and documents required herein, and a correct billing/invoice of amount due has been delivered to CES. Payment will not be made if any of the above criteria is not met or a good faith dispute exists as to any obligation to pay all or a portion of the account. *Any offer that requires payment in less than forty-five (45) days may not be considered.* CES must first receive payment from the Member in order to process payment to the contractor. Any contractor, whose business would be in jeopardy due to slow payments, is encouraged not to respond. It has been CES' experience that its Members always pay, but many are slow in processing payments.

Note: CES Members pay an administrative fee equal to one percent (1%) of the purchase price of goods and services purchased from CES contracts. Offerors will include the administrative fee in all pricing in the Discount and Price Schedule submitted. The contractor must allow CES to apply a one percent deduct prior to issuing its purchase order to the contractor. Contractor's invoice to CES will only reflect the actual amount due from CES. The CES administrative fee will be included in charges such as freight/shipping, bond costs and travel and per diem costs. The CES administrative fee is non-taxable and will be adjusted prior to CES issuing its purchase order.

Response 3:

CES under "**Billing**" must approve any and all changes to the purchase order, invoice and payment process. In the case of "**Leases and Rentals**" the purchase order will be issued by CES and the vendor will invoice the Member and the Member will pay the Vendor. CES will require copies of any executed lease agreements. CES will work with the awarded vendor and the Member as to the most efficient method for processing purchase orders and payments while complying with SLD rules and regulations.

Question 4:

RFP due date of December 12th, in my opinion it would be to CES' members best interest to not change the RFP due date, the award date is already pretty late in the E-Rate funding window.

Response 4:

CES issued Addendum 1 on November 17, 2008 changing the due date to Friday, January 9, 2009 at 1:30 p.m. at Cooperative Educational Services offices located at 4216 Balloon Park Rd. NE, Albuquerque, NM 87109. Question 5:

"What contract vehicle will be put in place to support an individual members' purchase of Vendor's product and services under terms offered by Vendor?"

Background:

RFP 2009-008, Section I: Instruction to Offeror, E; Listing of General Terms and Conditions, Related to Contract Award, Pages 21, 32 and New Mexico State Statutes 13-1-135 and 13-1-129

Authority: This RFP, as well as any resultant agreement, is issued under the New Mexico Procurement Code, CES Board Policies and CES Procurement Guidelines.

Awarding of Contract: CES reserves the right to make multiple awards, to award the entire solicitation to one responsible Offeror or to reject one or all bids. A response to the RFP is an offer for an award with CES based upon the terms, conditions, scope of work and specifications contained in this Request for Proposal. An RFP does not become an award until CES signs the Acceptance of Offer and Contract Award document, eliminating the need for a formal signing of a separate document.

Member of CES: Any public educational institution in the State of New Mexico that has by their board resolution resolved to become a party of the Joint Powers Agreement to Establish an Educational Cooperative and has been approved for Membership by CES' Board of Directors and the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration.

13-1-135. Cooperative procurement authorized.

- A. Any state agency or local public body may either participate in, sponsor or administer a cooperative procurement agreement for the procurement of any services, construction or items of tangible personal property with any other state agency, local public body or external procurement unit in accordance with an agreement entered into and approved by the governing authority of each of the state agencies, local public bodies or external procurement units involved. The cooperative procurement agreement shall clearly specify the purpose of the agreement and the method by which the purpose will be accomplished. Any power exercised under a cooperative procurement agreement entered into pursuant to this subsection shall be limited to the central purchasing authority common to the contracting parties, even though one or more of the contracting parties may be located outside this state. An approved and signed copy of all cooperative procurement agreements entered into pursuant to this subsection shall be filed with the state purchasing agent. A cooperative procurement agreement entered into pursuant to this subsection is limited to the procurement of items of tangible personal property, services or construction.
- B. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection A of this section, a cooperative procurement agreement providing for mutually held funds or for other terms and conditions involving public funds or property included in Section 11-1-4 NMSA 1978 shall be entered into pursuant to the provisions of the Joint Powers Agreements Act [11-1-1 NMSA 1978].

- C. Central purchasing offices other than the state purchasing agent may cooperate by agreement with the state purchasing agent in obtaining contracts or price agreements, and such contract or agreed prices shall apply to purchase orders subsequently issued under the agreement.

13-1-129. Procurement under existing contracts.

- A. Notwithstanding the requirements of Sections 13-1-102 through 13-1-118 NMSA 1978, the state purchasing agent or a central purchasing office may contract for services, construction or items of tangible personal property without the use of competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals as follows:
- (1) at a price equal to or less than the contractor's current federal supply contract price (GSA), providing the contractor has indicated in writing a willingness to extend such contractor pricing, terms and conditions to the state agency or local public body and the purchase order adequately identifies the contract relied upon; or
 - (2) with a business which has a current exclusive or nonexclusive price agreement with the state purchasing agent or a central purchasing office for the item, services or construction meeting the same standards and specifications as the items to be procured if the following conditions are met:
 - (a) the quantity purchased does not exceed the quantity which may be purchased under the applicable price agreement; and
 - (b) the purchase order adequately identifies the price agreement relied upon.
- B. The central purchasing office shall retain for public inspection and for the use of auditors a copy of each federal supply contractor state purchasing agent price agreement relied upon to make purchases without seeking competitive bids or proposals.

Response 5:

CES is composed of all of the 89 New Mexico public school districts and 81 other educational and public institutions that are parties to the Revised and Amended Joint Powers Agreement to Establish an Educational Cooperative as approved by New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) and authorized under the provisions of the Joint Powers Agreements Act [11-1-1 NMSA 1978]. CES procurement complies with the provisions of the State of New Mexico Procurement Code [13-1-1 to 13-1-199 NMSA 1978].

In 13-1-135 NMSA 1978 educational institutions and public bodies can enter into cooperative purchasing agreements that have been approved by DFA for common benefit. By being awarded a contract under a CES competitively bid solicitation, CES members can use CES contracts under 13-1-135 and 13-1-129 NMSA 1978 to procure goods and services. The competitively award bid or RFP is the contract vehicle to be used by CES Members.

Question 6:

Who is going to be the customer of record? Who will sign the agreement and ultimately be financially responsible?

Response 6:

As a requirement of the E-rate program, the school districts need to have funds available in their budgets for the applicable e-rate funding year. The Vendor, CES and Member will sign a three party agreement and the Member School District will have the final financial responsibility.

Question 8:

Is it acceptable for a bidder on RFP 2009-008 for Category 1 to submit pricing in a different manner than requested in the RFP. We are wondering if we may submit pricing as follows in an excel spreadsheet format:

Manufacturer, product Code, product description, and **manufacturer list price**, with a master understood discount for all items. This would allow NMEDU to get updated on the +1000 items from the manufacturer, without the need to receive constant "line item" discounted updates.

Background:

Form K - Instructions for Completion of Price Pages, page 126

Form K INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION OF PRICE PAGES

1. Before you begin, make duplicate copies of the price page.
2. All pricing must use the price form, normally using one sheet per brand of product. If you have an exceptionally large price list, or a price catalog, you may attach the data to the form, but it must be categorized and indexed in a way that the following information is clearly identified:
 - A. Product Brand
 - B. Product Description
 - C. Retail Price or Standard Education/Government Price
 - D. Percent Discount
 - E. CES Price
 - F. Volume Discounts Available

- G. Any Special Pricing (bundles, time-limit sales, etc.)
- H. Installation/Labor Costs, if any
- I. Mileage/Travel Costs, if any
- J. Freight/Shipping, if any
- K. Special Warranty Information

3. Once your offer is accepted, any future price adjustments must be made in the same manner.
4. It is your responsibility to keep your contract current in every way. Auditors review our contracts, and we want to keep everything legal.

IF, FOR ANY REASON, YOU NEED TO LOWER A PRICE TO REMAIN COMPETITIVE, OR TO PASS ON A SPECIAL PRICE OFFERED BY YOUR SUPPLIER, YOU MUST FIRST SEND A FAX OR LETTER TO CES THAT OFFICIALLY LOWERS THE PRICE. ONCE CES HAS RECEIVED THE INFORMATION, THEN YOU MAY OFFER THE NEW PRICES TO YOUR CUSTOMERS. IT IS AGAINST THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS RFP TO AGREE TO A LOWER PRICE WITH A CUSTOMER, AND THEN LATER NOTIFY CES. CES ENCOURAGES ALL OFFERORS TO OFFER THE LOWEST PRICES POSSIBLE, BUT AT NO TIME MAY THE OFFEROR GIVE A PRICE TO ONE CES MEMBER THAT IS NOT AVAILABLE TO OTHERS.

Response 8:

Due to the large quantity on pricing information request for this proposal, a proposer can submit pricing information on an excel spreadsheet and needs to follow the requirements listed in From K but does not have to submit a paper copy. The proposer is also required to submit the mandatory Form D-1 with their proposal.

Question 9:

If you are filing a Form 470 as a consortium, will CES then be the party the vendor has to contract with to work with the school districts (Would CES be our customer and the district be CES's customer) ? If so, will CES then have to file all of the Form 471's on behalf of the school districts? If you aren't sure maybe a call to the Client Services Bureau of USAC at 888-203-8100 might be a good idea.

Response 9:

CES has filed Form 470 as a consortium and listed school district and other eligible entities that can use our Form 470 to create their own Form 471. The eligible entities listed on CES Form 470, will be able to use the awarded vendors for the goods and services to create their own Form 471. In the case that more than one vendor is awarded a contract for the same goods and services, the entity will need to have a formal selection process to choose a vendor to provide the goods and services required and to list on their Form 471. After the selection process is completed by the entity, the selected vendor can provide the information needed for the creation of Form 471.

Currently CES will not be filing a consortium Form 471 but reserves the right to review this option in the future. The entities list on CES original and corrected Form 470 will be the only ones eligible to use CES Form 470.

Question 10:

Normally on Priority 1 services (where the customer doesn't own any of the equipment and just pays a monthly services bill) Trillion hasn't had the experience of having to produce bid bonds, performance bonds and payment bonds. Is it your intent to require these bonds for service providers?

Background:

See background information for Question 8

Response 10:

Bid, performance and payment bonds are only required for installation and constructions services. If a proposal contains installation or construction services, bid, performance and payment bonds will be required. Bid bond of \$25,000 with the submission of the proposal and performance and payments bonds for individual CES Member's prior to start up of a projects.

Question 11:

Please explain bonding requirements for a manufacturer and a sub-contractor (reseller) as it relates to this RFP?

Background:

RFP 2009-008, Category 1: Categorical Scope of Work, Item 13A, Page 60; 1978 New Mexico State Statutes 13-1-40, 13-1-146, 13-1-148.1 & 13-4-18; Section II: Scope of Work and Specifications, Item G. Bonds, Page 47; RFP 2009-008, Section I: Instruction to Offeror, E; Listing of General Terms and Conditions, Bonds, Pages 21

13. Construction and Contractor Requirements:

- A. A \$25,000 bid bond will be required if the Offeror will be providing installation and construction services.
- B. If the Offeror is providing installation of equipment services then they must demonstrate that it possesses the following contractor licenses to install Network and Network Infrastructure equipment:
 - 1). ES-3 Low Voltage Special Systems (under 50 volts).
 - 2). EE-98 Residential and Commercial Electrical.
 - 3). GB98 General Building – note: The work outside the scope of the prime contractor's license classification(s) must be subcontracted to an entity with a valid license in appropriate classification(s).
 - 4). The contractor license holder must be Offeror or qualifying party, must be on the Offerors payroll and cannot be a subcontractor.
 - 5). Copy of current New Mexico Contractor licenses.

- 6). Copy of New Mexico Department of Labor Registration.
- C. Offeror (functioning as a prime contractor) will cooperate with any architect, engineer, general contractor, subcontractor, or other vendor working on the same project, as necessary and as directed by the CES Member, to assure that the scope of work for a project is accomplished.
 - D. CES is looking for firms that have individuals who possess generally accepted industry training and certification. Offeror shall indicate what education, training and industry certifications their employees hold. Include steps that your firm will take to ensure that the education, training and certification are kept current for these employees. Place after Tab 8.
 - E. All equipment must be new, unused and listed by UL for the purpose intended. All electronics will be designed for continuous use without degradation of function or performance. When practical, one manufacturer will be used to guarantee compatibility. All equipment offered on this contract will be from manufacturers regularly engaged in telecommunication equipment and will be the latest standard designs current at the time of delivery.
 - F. All installation will be in strict compliance with manufacturer's recommendations and local, state and national legal codes and industry standards. During installation, all connections and pieces of equipment will be fully tested by a technical representative trained by the manufacturer. The contractor will only install local area network cable that has been tested and verified by ETL and has been listed in compliance with TIA/EIA, ISO/IEC, IBM or Bellcore Standards. As evidence of certification, a dated copy of a directory of ETL verified cable must be placed after Tab 8.
 - G. The system will be accepted in writing only after a satisfactory test of the entire system or installation in the presence of an authorized representative of the Member.
 - H. The Offeror will provide as part of any project comprehensive onsite training on the operation, testing and maintenance of the installed system to personnel selected by the CES Member.
 - I. All materials used by the Offeror/subcontractor at a worksite will have a Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) as required by law. The MSDS sheets will be filed in a centrally located area accessible by both the workers and Member's personnel.
 - J. All work sites must be returned to original condition, including patching, paving, and addition to fill and landscaping. Repair of sunken trenches or damaged asphalt or concrete by trenching or saw cutting is the sole responsibility of the Offeror.
 - K. All penetrations of walls and buildings must be sealed in an appropriate manner subject to the approval of the Member and must meet local and state fire codes.
 - L. All building cabling installed under this RFP will conform to ANSI/TIA/EIA-568-A standards.
 - M. All pathways and spaces in the infrastructure will conform to ANSI/TIA/EIA-569-A standards. Firestops and seismic considerations will be installed, as described in the latest edition of this standard. Pathways and space systems will be as independent as possible from the cabling and equipment that currently occupy the pathways and spaces.
 - N. All grounding and bonding of electrical infrastructure will conform to ANSI/TIA/EIA-607 requirements.
 - O. When a small building is being wired for telecommunications, ANSI/TIA/EIA-570 will be followed.
 - P. No cabling will be installed under a carpet in new construction or remodel.
 - Q. Any conduit that is installed with pulling wire must have steel elbows to allow pulling around a bend without destroying the elbow.
 - R. Hybrid cable will not be used in new construction and only in a remodel project when pathway problems cannot be overcome.

- S. The Offeror will install plenum-rated cable in all plenum spaces. Any non-plenum cable discovered in a plenum space will be replaced, unless the fire marshal approves, in writing, its non-removal.
- T. All infrastructures will be designed for easy change in the future.
- U. All system devices offered will be industry standards compliant.
- V. Work to be performed by the CES Member must be clearly described. Offeror must never assume the Member knows what steps are necessary prior to the start of a project. Offeror must be willing to assist the school in all aspects of a project.
- W. The condition of the site prior to start up will be agreed upon between the CES Member and the Offeror. The written correspondence will be drawn up by Offeror and the CES Member's representative and signed by both parties. Offeror shall assume full responsibility for the protection and safekeeping of any products stored on the premises.
- X. The review and approval process during a project may include, but is not limited to, the following:
 - 1). Prior to obtaining any supplies, materials and/or equipment or commencing any work for a project, the Offeror must obtain project approval from the Member and Member's design professional.
 - 2). In the event that any of the reviewing parties request changes to the submitted information, the Offeror will be responsible for ensuring that all others are advised of the change(s) and obtain their agreement on the change(s).
 - 3). In the event of a conflict between the reviewing parties, the Offeror must pursue the resolution of the conflict with the Member and the parties. The Offeror cannot start work until such conflict is resolved and signed by all parties.
- Y. Offeror will, upon request, submit complete documentation for the network system to the CES Member, or the Member's representative (including architect, engineer, or general contractor) for approval prior to work. The documentation will include model numbers, type, rating, size, style, manufacturer's name and manufacturer's catalog data sheets, cabling drawings, etc.

13-1-40. Definition; construction.

- A. "Construction" means building, altering, repairing, installing or demolishing in the ordinary course of business any:
 - (1) road, highway, bridge, parking area or related project;
 - (2) building, stadium or other structure;
 - (3) airport, subway or similar facility;
 - (4) park, trail, athletic field, golf course or similar facility;
 - (5) dam, reservoir, canal, ditch or similar facility;
 - (6) sewage or water treatment facility, power generating plant, pump station, natural gas compressing station or similar facility;
 - (7) sewage, water, gas or other pipeline;
 - (8) transmission line;
 - (9) radio, television or other tower;
 - (10) water, oil or other storage tank;
 - (11) shaft, tunnel or other mining appurtenance;
 - (12) electrical wiring, plumbing or plumbing fixture, gas piping, gas appliances or water conditioners;
 - (13) air conditioning conduit, heating or other similar mechanical work; or
 - (14) similar work, structures or installations.
- B. "Construction" shall also include:

- (1) leveling or clearing land;
- (2) excavating earth;
- (3) drilling wells of any type, including seismographic shot holes or core drilling; and
- (4) similar work, structures or installations

13-1-146. Requirement for bid security.

Bid security shall be required of bidders or offerors for construction contracts when the price is estimated by the procurement officer to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000). Bid security in an amount equal to at least five percent of the amount of the bid shall be a bond provided by a surety company authorized to do business in this state, or the equivalent in cash, or otherwise supplied in a form satisfactory to the state agency or a local public body.

13-1-148.1. Bonding of subcontractors.

A subcontractor shall provide a performance and payment bond on a public works building project if the subcontractor's contract for work to be performed on a project is one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) or more.

13-4-18. Construction contract performance and payment bonds.

- A. When a construction contract is awarded in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), the following bonds or security shall be delivered to the state agency or local public body and shall become binding on the parties upon the execution of the contract. If a contractor fails to deliver the required performance and payment bonds, the contractor's bid shall be rejected, its bid security shall be enforced to the extent of actual damages. Award of the contract shall be made pursuant to the Procurement Code [13-1-28 NMSA 1978] in the following manner:
- (1) a performance bond satisfactory to the state agency or local public body, executed by a surety company authorized to do business in this state and said surety to be approved in federal circular 570 as published by the United States treasury department or the state board of finance or the local governing authority, in an amount equal to one hundred percent of the price specified in the contract; and
 - (2) a payment bond satisfactory to the state agency or local public body, executed by a surety company authorized to do business in this state and said surety to be approved in federal circular 570 as published by the United States treasury department or the state board of finance or the local governing authority, in an amount equal to one hundred percent of the price specified in the contract, for the protection of all persons supplying labor and material to the contractor or its subcontractors for the performance of the work provided for in the contract.
- B. The state purchasing agent or the central purchasing office may reduce the amount of the performance bond required prior to solicitation to not less than fifty percent of the contract price if it is determined to be less costly or more advantageous to the state agency or local public body to self-insure a part of the performance of the contractor.
- C. The state purchasing agent or the central purchasing office may reduce the amount of the payment bond required prior to solicitation of not less than fifty percent of the contract price if it is determined that it is in the best interest of the state agency or local public body to do so. Factors to be considered in order to make such a determination include, but are not limited to:
- (1) the value and number of subcontracts to be awarded by the contractor; and
 - (2) the value of the contract.

- D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the authority of the state agency or local public body to require a performance bond or other security in addition to those bonds, or in circumstances other than specified in Subsection A of this section.
- E. For contracts under twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) the state agency or local public body may impose in its sole and complete discretion the requirements of Subsections A, B and C of this section.

G. BONDS

1. Upon execution of a contract between a CES Member and the prime contractor, performance and payment bonds will be provided the Member as required by New Mexico law.
2. The prime contractor will execute a performance bond in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the price specified in the contract between the Member and the prime contractor by a surety company authorized to do business in New Mexico. Performance bonds between the Member and the prime contractor will be on standard forms.
3. A payment bond, in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the price specified in the contract between the Member and the prime contractor, will be executed by a surety company authorized to do business in New Mexico. This bond will protect all persons supplying labor and material to the prime contractor for the performance of the work provided in the contract. Payment bonds between the Member and the prime contractor will be on the standard form.
4. The prime contractor will deliver both the performance and payment bonds to the CES Member at the time the contract between the Member and the prime contractor is executed and a copy will be provide to CES for its records..
5. All suits for nonpayment or nonperformance will be filed as allowed under New Mexico law.
6. The prime contractor will be responsible for providing CES with copies of all contracts and bonds in accordance with CES purchasing procedures.
7. Performance and payment bonds for Members outside New Mexico must be provided by companies licensed to provide bonds for public entities in the state of the Member. Bid securities are always with CES and provided by New Mexico licensed companies.

Bonds: All bid, performance and payments bonds are to be issued by a corporate surety authorized to do business in New Mexico in accordance with the New Mexico Insurance Code and be a surety listed in the US Treasury Circular 570.

Response 11:

CES has provided in the Background information the New Mexico state statues and CES Terms and Conditions that apply to bonding requirements for proposers. Bonds are only required if the proposer is submitting a proposal that includes construction services as defined in 13-1-40 NMSA 1978.

Pursuant to 13-1-146 NMSA 1978, CES has made the determination that any construction service over the life of the contract will total more then \$25,000. To be in compliance with 13-1-146 NMSA 1978 CES is requiring a bid bond for the Proposers who are offering constructions services as part of their proposal.

Listed in the General Terms and Conditions on page 21 is the bonding requirements for individual projects for the prime contractor. The prime contractor, pursuant to 13-4-18 NMSA 1978 will be required to provide performance and payment bonds for 100% of the project value. In the case of a subcontract, pursuant to 13-1-148.1 NMSA 1978 any subcontractor whose contract is over \$125,000 will be required to provide performance and payments bonds.

These requirements only apply to proposers that will be submitting a proposal that includes construction services.

Question 12:

Please explain manufacturer and reseller/agent in terms of sales and service?

Response 12:

Any proposer who is submitting a proposal and is not a manufacturer needs have a contractual relationship with the manufacturer so they can provide goods, services, warranty, repairs and can enter into a contract on behalf of the manufacturer. They will need to provide proof of this relationship by providing the information requested in "Form I - MANUFACTURER'S REPRESENTATIVE FORM "on page 117 of the RFP.

Question 13:

We are a licensed CLEC (Competitive Local Exchange Carrier) and as agent for Qwest Telecom services in New Mexico. What are the pricing options that are acceptable to CES given the vast amount of locations that need to be priced for all 89 school districts?
