Learn the background information necessary to teach struggling
readers.

In order to teach a phonetically based program it is essential to have
some background knowledge on the structure of the language.

We will also devote time to making some materials for you to take back
to your classroom.

Workshop will include:

- **Phonemes/Correct Sound Production** - Learn the correct pronunciation of consonant and vowel sounds (short and long sounds)
- **Digraphs & Trigraphs**- What are they and where are they typically found in words?
- **Consonant Blends** – How are they different from digraphs?
- **The Six Syllable Types of the English Language** – Knowledge of the syllable types will help determine the pronunciation of the vowels and thus help students with decoding
- **Syllable Division Rules** – Allow students to break down longer words into word parts and thus decode and spell longer words.
- **Common Spelling Rules** – Makes encoding much easier and more reliable
- **Common letter teams (patterns)** – Knowing alternate sounds of letter combinations is essential for both reading and spelling.
- **Morphemes/Common Latin and Greek Roots** – Breaking words into their morpheme structure will help greatly with vocabulary development.
- **Morphemes/Affixes (prefixes & suffixes)** - The study of these morpheme parts is a powerful way to develop vocabulary.
