Executive Functioning (EF) skills are the “management system of the brain”, which help us control and coordinate our thoughts and actions to achieve a goal. Challenges with EF isn’t a diagnosis or a learning disability, but they are common in people who learn and think differently, such as those with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and attention deficit disorders (ADD/ADHD). EF skills are essential for success in school, work, and life in general, such as:

- Attention
- Planning
- Time management
- Task initiation
- Organization
- Problem solving
- Working memory
- Flexible thinking
- Emotional and self-control

During this workshop, we will fill our toolbox with a multitude of strategies to support our students’ executive functioning. For students who learn and think differently, strategic and explicit instruction strategies are critical to increase engagement, academic success, social functioning, and overall classroom behavior.
