Approval of Minutes:

Audit:

Scott Eliason, CPA with Jaramillo Accounting Group LLC, presented the results of CES' audit. The independent auditors report stated that, in their opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material aspects, the respective financial position of the business-type activities of CES as of June 30, 2025 and 2024, and the respective changes in financial position and, where applicable, cash flows thereof for the years then ended in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America.

A motion to accept the audit as presented was made by Dr. Charley Carroll and seconded by Cody Patterson. Motion passed unanimously.

Agency Communications:

NMCCS – Erik Bose

Charter Schools will hold an annual conference mid – December at Tamaya Resort.

NMCEL – Stan Rounds

Stan discussed concern over the amount of superintendents' resignations. There is a need to determine the root cause for these resignations. The average tenure is two years.

NMCEL is set to meet with a liaison from the state's Finance Committee to discuss priorities for the 2026 legislative session. A central topic of concern is the potential decline in oil and gas revenues, which have historically provided a significant portion of the state's funding for public education.

Higher Education (2yr) – Dr. Charley Carroll

Dr. Carroll participated in multiple meetings to review construction cost trends and rising expenses in New Mexico. The discussions focused on concerns and strategies to mitigate cost increases.

Scholarship – Johnna Bruhn

The scholarship will be awarded October 15th, to Brian Snider, Jal Public Schools, during the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors.

Policy – Elisa Begueria

David provided an update on behalf of Elisa. The CES Board Policy was disseminated via email to the 89 Superintendents in New Mexico July 10, 2025, with a request for comments. To date, no comments, questions, or concerns have been received. The policy will be presented for approval and adoption at the Board of Directors meeting on October 15, 2025.

Program Overview/Reports

Six Year Study/Update

The six-year study continues to provide in-depth data analysis for the 13 participating districts. Teachers can now drill down into the data by cluster, standard, class, teacher, and student. Evan provides targeted training for district administrators to help them better support their teachers, while Kim focuses specifically on training teachers in effective data use and instructional strategies.

We have observed an increase in math outcomes across the 13 districts—an early positive indicator since the training began in June 2024.

In addition, CES will continue supporting the 13 districts through the Martinez/Yazzi Action Plan, ensuring that each district's Strategic Plan is either aligned with or adjusted to align with the plan's objectives.

LEAP Accreditation visit

LEAP recently completed its first accreditation visit since its inception. During the three-day review, the program was recognized for its strengths in retention and recruitment, curriculum relevance, collaboration and service orientation, the expertise of its coaching staff, access and affordability, and its commitment to continuous improvement.

Dr. Cindy Simms, a member of the review board, noted that the two representatives from higher education Central New Mexico Community College (CNM) and New Mexico State University were highly complementary of the program.

We are now in a 45-day waiting period for the official report and are anticipating positive results.

CTE update

The Executive Committee has approved \$150,000 to support school districts in the area of Career and Technical Education (CTE). Currently, nine of our thirteen school districts have identified CTE as a goal or included it in their action plans.

We are pleased to welcome Sharon West to CES as a member of the professional services staff. She will work with interested regions to provide support in developing career cluster pathways, establishing workplace learning experiences and mentorships, and building partnerships with higher education institutions to expand dual credit opportunities for the school districts.

Mr. Chavez has already met with representatives from four of the six regions and plans to meet with the remaining two. The overarching goal is to form a CTE consortium—an alliance that will serve as a unified body for advocacy and policy development. If issues need to be elevated to the legislative level, representatives from each of the six regions will collaborate to develop and present a formal proposal.

Million Dollar Club Dinner

Mr. Chavez encouraged everyone to attend the upcoming dinner where CES will recognize our partners who have made 1 million or more this year. These key partners are instrumental in funding our organization.

During the event Sharon West will deliver a presentation on CTE.

Expansion update

Mason Goold and Peggy Green have been actively promoting the word about our contracts in Utah. We have hired a representative for Idaho and plan to re-advertise to seek a second employee to serve Idaho

Workforce Solutions and wage decisions

Historically, CES has handled the acquisition of wage decisions for construction projects on behalf of school districts. To streamline the process and reduce confusion, this responsibility will now transition to the school districts. CES is able to obtain wage decisions on behalf of members but is not able to continue to obtain the other required construction documents for members.

Going forward, each district will be responsible for obtaining its own wage decisions. Thad Phipps and John King will be available to offer guidance and support as needed during this change.

To assist with the change, Workforce Solutions provided virtual training at the beginning of October to explain the new process and the reasons behind the decision.

Item C: The Executive Director requested a budget increase to support the addition of two staff members for our LEAP program.

A motion was made to approve the request to hire two additional coaches for LEAP with the amendment to add hiring a third coach as needed motion was made by Stan Rounds. Seconded by Dr. Cindy Simms. Motion passed unanimously.

Administrative and Finance Report**

This report reflects financial activity through December 2025.

Finance:

As of December 31, 2025, CES had total revenue of \$171,825,173 and SSC had total revenue of \$242,440. Total combined revenue was \$172,067,613 compared to total combined revenue of \$178,452,528 for December 2024. This is a 3.6% decrease, or \$6,384,914 less revenue this year compared to last year.

As of December 31, 2025, CES had an operating loss of \$31,805 and SSC had a profit of \$188,928. Together, both entities posted a combined profit of \$157,123 for the period.

As of December 31, 2025, CES' combined Net Fund Balance is \$22,544,259.

Through December 2025, CES staff had approved a total of \$275.8 million in purchase orders. Of this amount, Direct Purchase orders accounted for \$85.2 million, while Traditional purchase orders—including Gordian and RS Means—amounted to \$190.6 million. Purchase order approval decreased by \$4.3 million compared to the \$280.1 million approved in the previous year.

It is important to note that CES places purchase orders in pending status when there are issues with the member's purchase order or issues with the quote. As of December 2025, \$5.2 million in purchase orders were pending. Being able to approve these would have made volume comparable to the prior period. The Business Office is carefully monitoring purchase orders received to identify any fluctuations in volume.

The Business Department team has been diligently engaged in preparation for the implementation of new accounting and payroll systems. The projected go-live date has been revised to support the development of the interface for the new accounting system. This interface is designed to eliminate redundant data entry across multiple platforms and enhance operational efficiency. Assuming no additional delays occur in the interface development process, we expect to launch the new accounting system in March 2026. Meanwhile, payroll staff are actively processing payroll within the new system and conducting comprehensive training sessions for both managers and employees.

Budget:

CES Executives will soon start preparing the FY2026-2027 budget

Audit:

CES will need to solicit quotes for an audit firm for the financial and compliance audit for the FY2026. The audit will begin at the end of July or early August. The Jaramillo Accounting Group conducted the audit from FY2021 through FY2025.

Expansion:

CES received its first order from Utah, with Samsom Equipment supplying weight room equipment to a member. We expect order volume to grow as procurement initiates in-state solicitations and awards contracts.

Staff:

At present, there are no vacancies in the Business Department.

Strategic Plan:

The Strategic Plan for FY2025-2026 is a work in progress. The Business Department is focusing on implementing new accounting and payroll systems, staff training, process documentation, and creating training materials.

Ancillary

Strategic Goal #1: Operational Efficiencies and Customer Service Excellence

Action Plan 1: Increase percentages of Ancillary requests through enhanced recruitment and retention strategies.

2 Interviews, recommended 2, for 2nd Quarter for 25-26 school year. (COTA-1, LMSW-1) Have given RTS a February deadline to modify the “Apply Now” part of the CES website.

Total for ERB rejections: 25 staff rejected and no longer work for CES, 23 institutions affected, financial profit/loss **-\$245,529**.

Building contacts for all programs in tri-state area around New Mexico. I will start with major Universities with multiple programs and expect that this will take approximately a year and a half to get to all the locations in the 3 states in addition to my regular responsibilities.

Action Plan 2: Support the new system for CES, specifically for Ancillary Staff Data, Timesheets, Invoicing and Payroll.

We have successfully instituted new Bi-Weekly payroll calendar starting December 1. We have had some difficulty with RTS regarding them not being ready and staff having difficulty getting time in after a “window” closed from the previous system, but RTS came up with a patch and will institute changes to make the new two-week time cycle permanent.

Strategic Goal 2: Professional Development, Quality Instructional and educational Leadership

Action Plan 1: Expand PD opportunities for all staff.


CPI: Total of 14 Participants for CPI this First Quarter of 25-26.

Action Plan 2: Minimize Overages (Overage = staff exceeding allocations within a pay period.)

This will change because this was based on Semi-Monthly and we are now Bi-Weekly.



Events for 2nd Quarter 2025/26:

Working on finding other Career Fairs to attend, so far registered for the NMSU which will occur February 3 & 4, 2026.

Multiple emails and phone calls providing consultation for compliance and timeline issues.

Worked to find all Ancillary programs in all the states to build a data base for contacts and to know which institutions we can register for Career Fairs through Handshake.

As always, Payroll & Invoicing and the Ancillary Newsletter working in collaboration with TAP.

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Procurement Department Administrative Report – Gustavo Rossell

The CES Procurement Department continues with its mission to issue the solicitations and resulting contract vehicles for our members' use, nationwide, saving them time and hundreds of thousands of dollars annually.

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Administrative Report – Paul M. Benoit, Northern Services Manager

Northern Services Travel Notes

The first half of the year has been a whirlwind of travel to every region, a LOT of conferences, and training opportunities for our members/entities in purchasing through the bluebook, NMREAP, regional meetings, and general check-in and follow-up. I have been to every region at least twice in this period of time.

Direct Purchase/Digital Bluebook and DP Account Status

We have on-boarded two folks in Utah and one in Idaho. I am serving as “mentor” to Drew Evans in Idaho and, by the time of the Ex. Board meeting, I will have traveled to Idaho with Gustavo, to work a conference with Drew for the Idaho Counties. Drew and I work together on any questions/issues he encounters as he works to recruit entities and get CES “off the ground” in Idaho.

There are two initiatives going on from the main office that Jim and I have been monitoring, as these initiatives will impact our interactions with members. The first is the “TORQ” implementation that in which Sage is revamping the Bluebook, including how PO’s will be uploaded and processed. We are awaiting, at the time of this writing, more news on when Jim and I (and the Utah/Idaho staff) will be trained in the new bluebook so that we can hit the ground running with training when it goes live. The second initiative is with 3A and deals with marketing and branding, including focus group feedback from our members on how we can better serve. The first focus groups met last week (Week of Jan 11-18) with members to gather input. We are awaiting a compilation of the feedback received.

This semester promises to be busy with these initiatives, as Jim and I also monitor PO’s, keep CES in the forefront of our members/entities in our travels and correspondents, and continue to strive to ensure CES remains the first thought in their minds for procurement needs.

I put out reminders to all of the members/entities who had not yet taken advantage of the member service credits handed out at the regional meetings (to those who attended). The Business Office mailed out the majority of the certificates after the region meetings, but very few had been used as of January 1.

NMREAP NOTES

NMREAP subscriptions have held at status quo. We picked up a few new subscribers this year and lost a few, breaking “even” on number of subscribers. We are in the process of reviewing and ensuring that the NMREAP Application Document is compliant with HB12.

MEMBERSHIP DIRECTORY

The directory update was rather successful this fall, with a new email program Jim and I use. While I did not get a 100% response from all the Northern Members, in the directory, I had the best response (92%) to date.

We ended up having to move the directory from the sharepoint format, due to limitations in volume. Jim created a new, simple spreadsheet format. Staff now has access to the spreadsheet without any editing rights, while Jim and I maintain editing rights. This file is valuable to all staff, as it tracks a variety of position types in every entity (included in the appendices of this report). We also make this directory available to all contract holders for their use in marketing their CES contracts to our members.

Other

Jim and I continued to focus on customer service. The strategic plan is updated monthly and quarterly. Spring travel will include: Regional Travel (and scheduling of regional trainings once TORQ is up and running) and a variety of conferences: NMCounties, NM School Board Winter Conference, NMPED/NMASBO Spring Budget, NMASBO Winter Conference, El Paso Expo, NMSBA School Law, NM Municipal League (if regional meetings are resumed). NMPPA Spring Conference (If Scheduled).

Regularly review DP and Traditional Purchasing for use in the field, working with active members/PE's and to increase promotion of CES with all Members/PE's.

Provide support to departments and promote service programs (ALD, LEAP, TAP, Site) Follow up on all requests from Business Office for Member Services related to purchasing contracts. Follow up on all requests from the Procurement Office related to Vendor services. Assist in mass mail-outs to key contacts for TAP, SITE, LEAP, Contracts, Ancillary, etc.... Maintain Directory and an updated Superintendent list for emergency contacts.

Promote subscriptions. Training viability and enhancements.

Provide continued support to all subscribers for access to and use of NMREAP for job posting and applicant searches.

Maintain database of subscriptions, including renewal status, PO status, Invoicing status, and payment status. Work with Purchasing Specialist assigned to processing POs for invoicing.

Continue marketing NMREAP subscription services with all districts and charters.

Ensure the NMPED continues to distribute NMREAP information with all licensure applications.

Technology Department Administrative Report – Doug Marshall

Work is continuing with Sagecore to replace CES's current Bluebook and eProcurement systems both to modernize these systems and to support our multi-state expansion. We are in the final stages of testing and preparing to go live by March 1st. TORQ will unify our data systems and streamline the purchasing process. This will allow for easier administration, reporting and user access. It will make vendor and member interactions faster, provide immediate order status and allow more self-service options.

The implementation of Business Central and Integrity continues with a go live date of November 1st. We are in the final stages of testing and integration work and will begin Mock Go Live testing October 20. Business Central is replacing our current Great Plains accounting system and will bring new functionality and integration to TORQ. Integrity will integrate with Business Central and replace our current HR, PTO and Payroll and streamline the new hire onboarding, PTO and payroll processes. We are currently using Integrity for HR and onboarding, and it is working very well. Time keeping and PTO are now processing in Integrity, and payroll will move over with the go live for BC.

We are undergoing website updates to make the site more procurement forward to support expansion state users. The updates will make a clearer demarcation between Procurement and Educational support services and what services are available to expansion states.

Several IT Strategic Plan goals have been achieved or are well under way. Following are the major and their status:

Inventory of CES's IT environment – Completed with ongoing maintenance to keep it current.
Patch management system – Completed.

Implement a secure remote support tool to expedite end-user support – Completed.

Implement support ticketing system to track support requests, resolution steps and trends – Completed.

Security Assessments: Network documentation 90% complete, Inbound/Outbound traffic inspection 90% complete, Firewall security services configured and enabled 100% complete.
Network building together to address security, management and performance issues – Complete.

Implement MDM (Mobile Device management) – Complete.

Real-time inventory of end-user computers, status, warranty coverage and deployed software – Complete.

Computer upgrades and 4-year cycle replacement - Complete.

Implement Least Privileged access policies – 95% complete.

AV System: Assessment, Repairs and upgrades - 70% complete

AI: Copilot selected for CES internal use and deployed to test group along with initial training class by CNM. AI is also being integrated into TORQ for PO and document processing with excellent results so far.

Document network, data services and providers – Complete

Document Facility Services (HVAC, Fire, Security) and providers – Complete

Recover Administrative access to facility services (HVAC, Security, Lighting) – Complete.

Review Access control systems, upgrade system software and purge old employees and credentials – Complete.

Add load balancing and failover Internet connection – Complete.

Security Training – First round / baseline testing completed with 85% pass rate. We will be conducting additional testing and training in the coming months.

System Imaging – In progress 50% complete with Intune software deployment operational. We are starting Autopilot configuration and testing which should be completed by March.

Securing / Hardening internal networks – 50% complete. We are working with IT connect to complete this but will need to replace/upgrade some network hardware that is nearing End-of-life first.

End-user software Training – we have started compiling a list of software packages to train on and will conducting a poll to gage user interest. Once we have the poll results, we will begin scheduling training sessions.

I still have work to do on finding and implementing enterprise password management, backup solutions and updating the disaster recovery plan. There is also a lot of work to be done to secure the company SharePoint sites.

Administrative Report – Southern Services

February 2026

Member & Vendor Engagement

Southern Services maintained consistent, high touch engagement with members and vendors across Regions 6, 7, and 8, and portions of Region 4 (South). Regular support was provided through phone calls, email correspondence, and targeted in person outreach to assist members with identifying appropriate vendors, navigating CES contracts, submitting purchase orders, resolving invoicing questions, and addressing construction related compliance requirements.

Specific engagement during this period included ongoing support to entities such as **Las Cruces Public Schools, Doña Ana County, City of Sunland Park, Village of Columbus, and Town of Silver City**, as well as coordination with regional special districts and higher education partners, to address needs going beyond the usual sets of questions/concerns. Assistance frequently involved helping members identify vendors capable of addressing specialized needs, including facilities improvements, fleet and equipment purchases, and construction or renovation projects requiring careful compliance with CES and state requirements.

Examples of hands on support included guidance related to **Gordian and RSMeans quote handling**, clarification of vendor administrative fee structures, invoice resolution for municipal projects, and coordination with vendors when orders or deliveries required additional follow-up. These efforts ensured members were connected with vendors capable of delivering best value solutions while minimizing administrative delays.

Member & Vendor Education

Southern Services continued to emphasize education as a core strategy for improving efficiency and reducing processing delays. Staff consistently reinforced proper use of CES contracts, payment application requirements, and Bluebook navigation through one-on-one assistance and follow-up communication. Previously developed training resources remained in active use and were supplemented with individualized guidance for members and vendors requiring additional clarification.

Education efforts particularly benefited school districts and municipalities working through construction, facilities, and fleet related procurements, where accurate documentation and adherence to process are critical to timely project execution.

Member Orientation Efforts

Work continued on refining structured yet customized orientation approaches for new and existing members. These efforts are designed to provide consistent foundational knowledge while allowing flexibility to address differences in organizational size, staffing capacity, and procurement complexity across K-12 districts, municipalities, counties, and special districts.

Mass Communications

Targeted mass communications remained a key outreach tool. Emails were distributed to southern members by role and functional area, including **CEOs, CFOs, Purchasing, Facilities/Maintenance, IT, Transportation, and Special Education** directors. Content included vendor offerings in areas such as facilities, fleet, lighting, instructional resources, and professional services; compliance reminders; CES training opportunities; and program updates intended to support operational planning and decision making.

Newsletters

Member and Vendor newsletters were compiled and distributed during each applicable month, providing curated updates on CES contracts, programs, training opportunities, and operational reminders. Newsletter content was aligned with concurrent outreach and served as a reliable reference point for members and vendors.

Social Media

Social media activity continued steadily, supporting CES programs, vendor offerings, and events. Coordination with communications staff ensured consistent messaging, use of branded visuals, and timely posting across CES platforms, with content linking back to the CES website to improve visibility and access to information.

Membership Directory & Data Management

Maintenance and refinement of the CES Membership Directory continued throughout the period. Updates focused on improving data accuracy, expanding contact coverage, and responding to member-initiated update requests. Outreach to executive assistants, purchasing staff, and other key contacts supported verification of roles and responsibilities, reinforcing the directory's role as a reliable tool for targeted communications and efficient regional outreach.

Strategic Coordination

Southern Services maintained close coordination with CES internal departments, remaining attentive to opportunities to support programs and initiatives relevant to southern New Mexico members. This included awareness and promotion of offerings such as **TAP workshops**, leadership development programs, and vendor supported training opportunities. Ongoing strategic conversations helped ensure alignment between regional member needs and broader CES initiatives.

Conferences, Meetings & Outreach

Staff continued to participate in meetings and outreach activities that support relationship building with members, vendors, and partner organizations. Engagements included follow-up conversations with vendors such as **American Pro Builders, Next Level, and Amergis**, as well as coordination with other fleet, facilities, and construction partners. These interactions reinforced CES visibility, provided opportunities to address questions in real time, and strengthened trust in CES as a cooperative partner.

Key Outcomes

Sustained high touch support for members and vendors across southern regions, including both Members and Participating Entities.

Continued emphasis on education and compliance related to quotes, purchase orders, invoicing, and construction documentation

Ongoing delivery of targeted communications, newsletters, and role specific outreach

Continual improvement in Membership Directory accuracy, usability, and coverage

Strengthened coordination with CES Professional Development programs and other internal CES teams

Southern Services remains focused on responsive member support, clear communication, and practical education that enables members and vendors to use CES contracts and programs efficiently and compliantly. This reporting period's activities reflect steady progress toward improved operational clarity, strengthened regional relationships, and continued cooperative growth across southern New Mexico.

The Human Resources Department spent this quarter using the Integrity Data HRP Onboarding Dashboard to onboard all New Hires for the second quarter, October 3-January 22, a total of 16 New Hires. Discoveries have been made by the practical daily use of the Integrity HRP system versus the vision one develops regarding a new system's intent when being trained and told how the system will perform. Every system has idiosyncrasies that need to be worked out. For one instance, in the Employee Profile, the County cell must be typed out. If not entered, it auto-populates to New Mexico which then creates an error when the background check is employed. As a result of the internal issue identified, it became necessary to revise the embedded onboarding messages sent to new hires. Each job title that had been created required a tailored message to ensure that employees received explicit instructions relevant to their specific roles. In addition, the Welcome Email also changed to make clear the importance of entering one's County.

As part of its ongoing strategic plan, CES is committed to operating with greater efficiency and effectiveness. This commitment played a significant role in the decision to adopt a comprehensive platform capable of handling multiple essential functions within a single system. The platform was selected not only to streamline the onboarding process for new employees but also to integrate payroll and time clock management functions. By consolidating these tasks, CES aims to reduce redundancies, minimize errors, and improve overall workflow, supporting the organization's broader goal of optimized performance and resource management.

An example of this is the Compensation Workflow that is now being utilized between the Business Office Chief Financial Officer and the HR Department. Throughout the contract year, we have quarterly milestones for our Purchasing Specialist in which they may receive a Wage Adjustment. In the past, it was completed mostly on paper. A form was submitted to HR reflecting the new wage, then documented on an excel spreadsheet in HR, then submitted to payroll folder with an email notification to make department aware of the action to change it in the payroll system for the next pay period. With Integrity, the CFO enters the new wage, effective date, pay type, pay frequency and reason with a comment. A notification is sent to HR for approval. Once approved, it then is automatically 'sent' to the payroll side of Integrity. No additional entry needed.

Lastly, HR Directly had exit interview with Julie Garcia, POMS Regional Director, to review HR 128 Survey Questionnaire conducted in the Fall of 2025 to assess the process in which CES conducts HB 128 2021 Expanded Background Checks. This was to determine the discount on liability insurance for CES. CES was granted the discount based on our processes and compliance with HB 128 2021.

Administrative Reports – David Chavez

Action Items

Item (a): Request for discussion and approval of the CES Professional Development programs for the 2026-2027 fiscal year. The following programs are currently financially supported by CES.

The Technical Assistance Program (TAP), directed by Loretta Garcia, is the oldest professional development initiative at CES. It features a team of 18 special education experts who host several virtual sessions each month on various subjects. These sessions can also be conducted in person at the regional level when requested by multiple districts in a region. This program is funded by New Mexico Public Schools Insurance Authority.

School Improvement Technical Expertise (SITE) – SITE is overseen by Kim Mizell and a staff of approximately 10 subject matter experts. This program provides complimentary professional development for school districts in areas like Mathematics, Literacy, Professional Learning Communities, Standards Alignment, high yield instructional strategies, data analysis and implementation.

Leadership -ALD is overseen by LeAnne Gandy and a staff of approximately 8 SMEs. The following are programs supported by ALD:

Principal Mastery Collaborative (PMC) Principals, join a co-hort group for a transformative year of leadership development the will drive growth and enhance student and staff engagement.

Leadership Series – Monthly learning opportunities for leaders across the state that focuses on critical topics designed to enhance educational practice.

First Year Superintendents Academy (FYSA) – CES has designed this year-long academy to focus on strategic, relevant content alongside powerful interactions and networking opportunities with educational and legislative leaders across the state.

First Year Principals Academy (FYPA) – FYPA provides a year of ongoing learning, support, and coaching. Targeted professional learning designed specifically for new campus administrators begins with an intensive summer workshop designed to fine-tune leadership skills, strategic planning, and preparation for the school year.

Aspiring Superintendents Academy (ASA) – The ASA program, in collaboration with NMSSA, provides a full year of rich experiences for learners who aspire to ready experiences for learners who aspire to ready themselves for Superintendent responsibilities.

Principal Learning Institute (PLI) – This program is designed to support sitting principals assisting them in navigating the complexities of the principalship. Learning is engaging, relevant and collaborative. The program emphasizes and develops critical leadership skills and leads to discovery of new ways of thinking and strategies they may implement on their campuses.

Administrators Leadership Development (ALD) – The ALD program is a year-long PED approved opportunity for current outstanding NM educators to acquire their 3B Administrative License. Focused learning designed for building leadership instructional knowledge, communication skills, and other significant skills will prepare participants to become strong and valued district educational leaders.

Board Leadership Development - This opportunity, in collaboration with NMSBA, provides leadership training to new and experienced Board members across New Mexico. Sessions are designed strategically to strengthen educational outcomes across all school districts.

Executive Coaching – This opportunity provides school leaders an opportunity to gain momentum, to have a safe place to think out loud while their coach supports them. It provides leaders in the program to plan for the future, structure difficult conversations, or reflect on how to become more self-aware. This program assigns an Executive Coach to each participant.

Leading Educators Through Alternative Pathways (LEAP) – CES LEAPP is a year-long, cohort based alternative licensure program. The program is available statewide and includes online coursework and monthly in-person training designed for full-time classroom teachers in their first year of alternative licensure teacher of record preparation. Each year, approximately 200 candidates from across New Mexico CES-LEAP Preliminary CSA Report 1 PRELIMINARY participate in the CES LEAP program over an 11-month program period. Candidates are selected through an application and interview process.

Item (b) Request authorization to apply the same salary increase for our CES Ancillary Staff that is approved and signed by the governor for teachers during this session. CES has attempted to provide the same compensation increases for our Ancillary staff that is approved by the majority of school districts. This allows CES to remain competitive and assist us in recruiting staff for our participating districts.

Item C: Request permission to reschedule our CES Board meeting to coincide with the NMCEL summer conference. Due to low attendance, we plan to discontinue the CES Leadership Conference, which previously hosted our annual Board meeting. After speaking with Mr. Rounds, he agreed to let CES use one of the summer conference luncheons for our Board meeting.

Item D: Request approval of the American Alliance for Innovative Systems (AAIS) Six-Year Study contract for 2026-2027 in the amount of \$635,740.00. This contract supports twelve of the thirteen school districts in the six-year study. The contract will deliver access to the AAIS Learning Management System for onboarding teachers and instructional leaders for cohort training. 16 cohort trainings providing professional development for teachers and instructional leaders to build understanding, connect ideas, and extend learning into new contexts. 33 days of on-site campus visits: for the purpose of modeling engaging lesson launches, observe student inquiry, and coach teachers on curiosity-driven starts. 12 onsite administrator walk-through trainings; 2 days of strategic planning with CES for the purpose of strategic planning, data analysis, problem solving, development and revision of tools and processes, and coordination of logistics. These are First Quarter contract days the are replicated for the second quarter of the year.

I've attached the contract for your review prior to the meeting. AAIS representatives will be at the meeting to answer questions.

Item F. Request approval of AAIS Contract to conduct program audits of the 13 districts in the six-year study total budget of \$138,000.00. The contract will provide virtual meetings with school districts and school leaders regarding logistics and the creation of customized ~~data~~ gathering tools and rubrics. 13 On-Site

District-Level Systems Reviews, 22 On-Site School-Level Data Gathering and staff Interviews, 9 days for Virtual Data Collection, Artifact Analysis, and Interviews, 7 days for report writing and submission.
